

2021 JOE NAAR MEMORIAL REGATTA

Shattemuc Yacht Club Saturday, July 24th, 2021

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 The equipment and measurement rules of the class associations of all boats entered shall apply.
- 1.3 Changes to the *Racing Rules of Sailing* are described below.

2. SAFETY

A US Coast Guard approved personal flotation device shall be worn, properly fastened, at all times while launching and when sailing, except for brief times when changing clothing. This changes the preamble to Part 4 and Rule 40.

3. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

0900 - 0930 hrs	Registration & check-in, SYC clubhouse deck
0930 hrs	Skippers Meeting, SYC clubhouse deck
1030 hrs	First warning signal
Lunch	A lunch break is planned, weather pending (BYO)
1200 - 1300 hrs	Laser Registration
1330 hrs	Races Resume, First Laser Start
Awards	To follow racing, SYC Clubhouse deck

4. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the clubhouse deck.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Boats are not allowed to leave the marina until a "Harbor Start" is declared by the Race Committee. This applies in the morning, as well as after any lunch break.

6. RACING AREA

The racing area will be the Hudson River within the vicinity of the Shattemuc Yacht Club, south of Croton Point, and north of the Tappan Zee Bridge.

7. THE COURSE

- 7.1 Attachment A shows diagrams of the courses, including their designation.
- 7.2 No later than the warning signal, the Race Committee will display on a course board, or verbally hail, the course designation.

8. MARKS

Marks will be either red, yellow, or white balls. If a mark is moved during the race, the new mark may be the original mark or a new mark.

9. THE START

9.1 Races will be started using Appendix U: The sound-signal starting system. (3 minutes)

- 9.2 The starting line will be between a staff, stay, or halyard displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee boat and the course side of the nearby starting mark.
- 9.3 The Race Committee will verbally announce which class will be starting and display a class flag. Classes not starting should stay clear of the Starting Area.

10. CHANGE OF COURSE

If the Race Committee changes the position of a mark, code flag C need not be flown nor does the Race Committee have to signal the direction of the mark change nor any change in length. This modifies Rule 33. The Race Committee will attempt to signal competitors that they moved a mark at the preceding mark through verbal hails.

11. THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between a staff, stay, or halyard displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee boat and the course side of the nearby finishing mark.


12. PROTESTS

- 12.1 A boat intending to protest about an incident that occurs in the racing area shall notify the Race Committee of her intention as soon as possible after finishing, identifying the boat(s) being protested. Rule 61.1(a) still applies.
- 12.2 Protests shall be in writing and delivered to the Race Committee within 30 minutes after the time of the docking of the Race Committee.
- 12.3 Appendix T will apply, with the first sentence of T1(b) replaced by: A Post-Race Penalty is calculated as stated in Rule 44.3(c) with the number of places being 2. However, Rules 44.1(a) and (b) still apply. A boat takes a Post-Race Penalty by informing the Race Committee in writing and identifying the race number as well as when and where the incident occurred.


13. SCORING


- 13.1 The Low Point System of Appendix A will apply.
- 13.2 One race shall be completed to constitute a series.
- 13.3 There will be a 20 minute time limit from the time the first boat in each fleet crosses the finish line. Any boat that finishes after this will receive a score equal to the number of boats to finish that race plus 1. This modifies Rule A5.2.
- 13.4 Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated. If a race official determines a competitor's conduct is unsportsmanlike he/she will be DQ'd for that race. If there is a second violation, he/she will be asked to leave the regatta.
